YOUR PERSONAL TUTOR

We place a great deal of emphasis on students' personal study and self-motivation, and assign each student to a Personal Tutor. A-LEVELS

British A-Levels are globally recognised as a gold standard in education – an excellent preparation for universities worldwide.

TWO-YEAR A-LEVEL

You will study three or four A-Levels over a period of two years, at the end of which you will be assessed with a short series of public examinations. The College offers over 40 possible subjects, and we will advise you of the best A-Level combination based on the degree you wish to study at university.

ONE-YEAR A-LEVEL

The intensive style of teaching and the efficiency of the tutorial method used at Oxford Tutorial College enable us to prepare some students for A-Level examinations in just one year. This assumes that these students possess the required academic skills and, especially in the sciences, prior knowledge of the subject. A one-year A-Level course places greater responsibility on the student to study efficiently.

5-TERM A-LEVEL (JANUARY START)

This programme is identical to the two-year programme, except that students begin their studies in January. As the course is a few months shorter, the first 'AS' year is studied in an accelerated six-month course from January to June, and the second 'A2' year follows in September as normal.

FLEXIBLE START DATES

Our teaching methods allow flexibility in starting courses outside the normal term start dates, meaning it is possible to enrol at the College at any time. Students who do so receive individual tuition sessions before joining a study group – where necessary. Please enquire with us if you would like to explore this option.

GCSE

Oxford Tutorial College's GCSE programme offers a focused preparation for A-Level study.

ONE-YEAR GCSE COURSE

This course provides an excellent opportunity to prepare for A-Level study, retake exams to improve existing GCSE grades, or study extra subjects. Most universities now require you to demonstrate proficiency in Maths and English, with C grades at minimum in these subjects; some degrees may require other GCSE subjects in addition.

English Language support is included, and you will be mentored by a personal tutor to ensure you are making good progress. You have the opportunity to pursue your interests through our extra-curricular and social programme, with trips, sports and cultural events in and around Oxford.

To be accepted onto the GCSE programme, you must be sure you can cope with an intensive one-year course of study in 5 to 7 GCSE subjects. You should have a reasonable level of English proficiency equivalent to an IELTS score of 5.0 (at minimum).

BTEC

Our BTEC course is suited to those who want a more practical learning experience with no exams, and is the equivalent of two A-Levels.

The BTEC Level 3 Business programme is a university access qualification that offers an introduction to the core areas of business, taken over 1 or 2 years. It counts as the equivalent of two A-Levels, and yields the same level of UCAS (university entry) points.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The course consists of 12 units that are assessed in College; there are no external exams. All students take four core units that introduce the fundamentals of business organisations:

- The business environment
- Introduction to marketing
- Business resources
- Business communication

Eight other units come from a list of more specialist areas, including finance, management, promotions, market research, business enterprise, and human resources. Students learn how to:

- Research
- Develop their communication skills
- Give presentations
- Study a wide range of business topics.
- Produce reports
- Work in teams

All of our Business teachers have strong academic credentials and have also enjoyed successful business careers.

WHY CHOOSE BTEC?

When combined with academic learning in a school or college (or as a stand-alone course in further or higher education), a BTEC develops a range of practical knowledge and skills which help learners to prepare for – and progress in – their chosen career.

For students with aspirations to attend universities such as Oxford and Cambridge, A-Level qualifications remain the gold standard, but a BTEC qualification is accepted by 95% of UK universities.

ADDITIONAL COURSES

ACADEMIC PREPARATION PROGRAMME (APP)

This programme gives you the English support you need to thrive in your academic studies. Designed specifically to ensure those students who do not have English as their first language can get all the support they need with a mixture of English, IELTS preparation and Study Skills to prepare them for the rest of their course.

OXFORD ADVANCED STUDIES PROGRAMME

The Oxford Advanced Studies Programme (OASP) is a tailored course for international students aged 16+ who would like to spend an enriching semester in Oxford while kick-starting their university careers.

EASTER REVISION COURSES

For nearly 20 years Oxford Tutorial College has been running Easter Revision Courses in Oxford to help A-Level, GCSE and Cambridge Pre-U students get a head start on their summer exams. Our courses are structured to motivate and challenge students in their studies and to boost their confidence. We deliver our courses in small groups and provide an academically stimulating environment, encouraging greater student involvement in the learning process.

EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION

A-Level students can choose to take an EPQ in addition to their main subjects. EPQ is highly-valued by universities because it demonstrates a self-directed and self-motivated project, and develops independent thinking and analytical skills. It is worth half an A-Level and typically takes six months to complete. Students are mentored by an EPQ supervisor who guides them through the process of refining the topic, conducting the research, and presenting the final work.

CLUBS & SOCIETIES

The College offers a lively programme of activities – for memories of Oxford that will last a lifetime.

Throughout the year, Oxford Tutorial College runs a number of extra-curricular activities, including debating, music, film, law, table tennis and football – along with social events such as international evenings, fundraising events and film screenings.

There are also many other student-run sports clubs and societies. These include basketball, soccer, book club, and the law society: clubs change each year and are determined by student interests.

Students wishing to play rugby, hockey, lacrosse or any other team sport on a serious basis can often be introduced to city or University clubs.

You can also:

- Join our Student Council to help organise events for the College, meet with College officers, and become a charity fund-raiser.
- Enter competitions relevant to your subjects, such as mathematics Olympiads and writing challenges.
- Carry out work experience (pending visa restrictions) relevant to your intended career.
- Gain membership to the Oxford University Student Union and have access to world-famous debates, a large library, and social events.

ACTIVITIES & EVENTS

From its museums, world-famous university and historic buildings, to its excellent theatres, cinemas and restaurants, you'll never be short of something to do.

During the year, we arrange outings and trips in Oxford that complement the academic curriculum. Theatres and cinemas are both plentiful in Oxford, and visits are organised each term to at least one production.


We also periodically arrange visits to Oxford's many galleries and museums, including the Ashmolean, the Pitt Rivers, the University Museums and the Museum of Modern Art. The constituent colleges of Oxford University date from as early as the thirteenth century and each has its own architectural beauty, art treasures, peaceful ambience and delightful gardens. Students enrolled in our Oxford Advanced Studies Programme are automatically given membership of the world-renowned Oxford Union Society for the duration of their stay. Other students can apply for membership for the union for a nominal fee.

Students are also encouraged to take part in the rich cultural life that Oxford has to offer. This gives them the opportunity to use English in a variety of real-life contexts, such as watching sports events, discovering local history, and visiting a variety of universities around the UK.

YOUR HOME AWAY FROM HOME

Students can live in our comfortable College residences in central Oxford, or with friendly local host families.

It's important that all students feel comfortable, happy and at home during their stay with us, so every effort is made to match each student to the right accommodation. Our Accommodation and Welfare Officer is available to help arrange suitable accommodation and provide support should personal or domestic issues arise.



The College offers students a range of options to choose from:

INDEPENDENT RESIDENCE (FOR AGES 18+)

This self-catering residence has all the benefits of independent living with the reassurance of a residence supervisor. The residence is located near the centre of Oxford about a 20 to 25 minutes' walk from the College. Rooms are normally taken for a full academic year.

- High-quality décor with a boutique hotel feel
- Three well-equipped kitchen and lounge areas provide great social space
- Shared bathroom and private bathroom options
- A range of rooms available – from study bedrooms to spacious suites

MANAGED RESIDENCE (FOR AGES 15-17)

The residence is about a 12 to 15-minute walk to the 15-17 age residence from the College. It has 24-hour staff cover from our Residence Supervisors, who are available to give personal supervision and support at any time of the day or night. Male and female students reside in separate areas with controlled access; rooms are normally taken for a full academic year, excluding Christmas and Easter term breaks.

- Single study bedrooms with private bathroom
- Communal dining room and kitchenettes throughout the residence
- Breakfast and an evening meal are provided 7 days a week
- Separate lounge area with TV/Netflix
- Laundry facilities are included

HOST FAMILIES (FOR AGES 15+)


A student living with a host family enjoys a single study bedroom, with a breakfast and evening meal provided. We maintain in close contact with all our host families, most of whom have been providing for our students for a number of years.

PRIVATE RENTAL (FOR AGES 18+)

If you are 18 years or older, you may wish to rent a private property. Please note that we are unable to offer assistance in finding private flats/houses and suggest contacting local property agents. We recommend that contracts are checked carefully before signing and that insurance cover is taken out for personal belongings. Please ask for our list of suggestions of reputable landlords and places to search.

If you are aged under 17, you will need to stay in our accommodation or you may live with a suitable guardian with your parent's permission.



PERSONAL SUPPORT

We take care of your emotional and physical wellbeing to ensure you can concentrate on your studies. At Oxford Tutorial College, we take steps in all areas of College life to ensure that your welfare is safeguarded.

ARRIVAL AND INDUCTION

You'll receive a lot of support both before and during your studies. For an additional fee, a pick-up service can be arranged from the airport: one of our representatives will meet you and take you safely to your accommodation. We'll also help you with other practical matters during Orientation, such as registering with the police, opening a bank account, using public transport, hiring a bicycle and getting to know Oxford.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Academic supervision enables students to discuss concerns about their work, and is supportive while being practical and balanced. For those who struggle at first to make progress in English, the Academic Preparation Programme (APP) is designed specifically to help non-native speakers with a mixture of English, IELTS and Study Skills tuition.

WELFARE

You'll have a Personal Tutor as your first point of contact, and the Accommodation and Welfare Officer can talk to you about issues that are more sensitive. The Student Services Director is also available to help with difficulties and listen to any problem, however trivial it may seem. If necessary, we can also arrange for you to meet with an independent counsellor. These meetings are only arranged with your consent.

GUARDIANS

If you're under the age of 16, you must have a guardian. We also strongly advise you to have a guardian if you're aged between 16 and 18, so that there is someone in the UK who can act on your parents' behalf in the event of an emergency.

HEALTHCARE

We require you to register with a doctor when you arrive in Oxford. This is necessary to receive free treatment in an emergency, and we'll help you with the registration process when you arrive. We have access to an excellent team of health professionals. Medical treatment on the National Health Service is usually free to students, except for hospital stays. Make sure you take out medical insurance before you leave home to cover hospital stays and any accidents or illnesses that might interrupt your studies. These can normally be covered by extending an existing policy.

- A copy of your passport and your current UK visa (or any previous UK visas, if you have studied in the UK previously)
- A health questionnaire
- A non-refundable Registration Fee
- A refundable Academic Deposit
- Evidence of the level of your English language*
- Evidence of previous studies (exam certificates, transcripts and references)



STEP FOUR: SKYPE INTERVIEW

STEP FIVE: ACCEPT YOUR PLACE

To accept your place on the course you will need to make full payment for a minimum of 3 academic terms' tuition. A number of further documents will be requested depending on the type of Tier 4 visa you will be applying for (Tier 4 Child or General).



STEP SIX: CERTIFICATE & VISA

Once we have received all of the correct documentation, you will be issued with your Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) number, so that you can apply for a UK visa.
